Cf Lata Mangeshkar



Lata Mangeshkar was born on 28 September 1929 in a Maharashtrian Brahmin family the eldest daughter of Deenanath Mangeshkar, a Marathi and his wife Shudhamati, a Gujarati in Indore. Her father, Deenanath, was a classical singer and theatre actor. Deenanath adopted the surname Mangeshkar in order to identify his family with his native town of Mangeshi, Goa. Lata was named "Hema" at her birth. Her parents later renamed her Lata after a female character, Latika, in one of her father's plays.

She was an Indian playback singer and occasional music composer. Her contribution to the Indian music industry in a career spanning seven decades gained her honorific titles such as the "Queen of Melody", "Nightingale of India", and "Voice of the Millennium".

Lata recorded songs in over thirty-six Indian languages and a few foreign languages, though primarily in Marathi, Hindi, and Bengali. Her foreign languages included English, Russian, Dutch, and Swahili. She received several accolades and honors throughout her career. In 2001, in recognition of her contributions to the nation, she was awarded the Bharat Ratna, India's highest civilian honour.

She died from multiple organ dysfunction syndrome on 6 February 2022, at the age of 92. The Government of India announced a two-day period of national mourning and that the national flag will fly at half-mast from 6 to 7 February throughout India out of respect for her.





This lesson helped the man's sons understand the power of being a team and promised their father that, moving forward, they would work together as a team, no matter what the situation was.


The Moral:


- 1) Nataraja is depiction of the lord shiva as the cosmic dancer.


